1. What is the smallest number of oranges which can be shared equally among either 4, 9 or 12 disciples?
2. After having supper, Luke, Mark and Judas decided to visit the homes of the young disciples in the upcoming week. They shared the names of these disciples among themselves in the ratio 3: 5: 2. Judas and Mark together received 42 names. How many names in all were shared?
3. A new tunic for the supper cost 670 drachmas (D670). At the store, James traded in his old pair of sandals for D52 which was used as a down-payment together with D63. He completed the purchase of the tunic by paying 8 weekly payments of D89. How much is saved by paying cash for the tunic?

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4. In Bethlehem, the cost of one fish is three times the cost of a loaf of bread. If a fish costs 12 drachmas,
- (a) What is the cost of a loaf of bread (in drachmas)?
 - (b) Peter spends 340 drachmas (D340) preparing supper for his friends. If he bought 21 fishes, how many loaves of bread did he buy?
5. If 1 drachma (1D) = \$US 2.50:
- (a) How many \$US is equivalent to D340?
 - (b) How many Ds is equivalent to \$US130?
